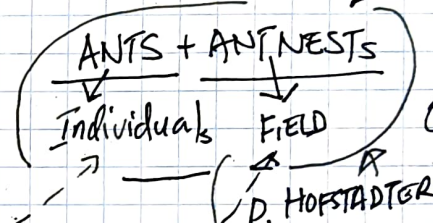

Reflection ON THIS ARTICLE
CONCEPT OF PSYCHOPATHOLOGY + the FIELD

- ① DEPRESSION = Giving up on getting support from the field
- ② ANXIETY = Being abandoned from the field / losing touch = the field.
- ③ AGGRESSION-RAGE = Controlling / overpowering the intrusive / overtly field.
- ④ DISSOCIATION: Isolating self from the toxic field
- ⑤ PSYCHOSIS: Dislocation from the field
- ⑥ DEPENDENCE: Losing self to the field.

CONTACT FIELD
What about interruptions
Projection: Putting something into the field (ATTRIBUTION?)
INTROJECTION: SWALLOWING SOMETHING FROM THE FIELD?
CONRUENCE = MANIPULATING THE FIELD?
DEFLECTION: AVOIDING THE FIELD?
ECLITISM: ISOLATING FROM THE FIELD?
RETROFECTION: protective field for self
